

[How To] Change Windows Display Language

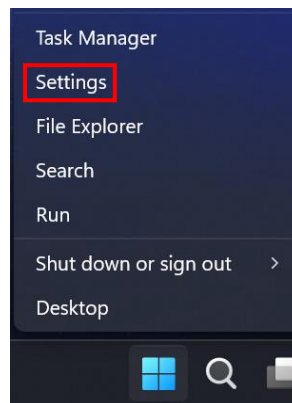
This guide shows how to add a second or more system display language in Windows system.

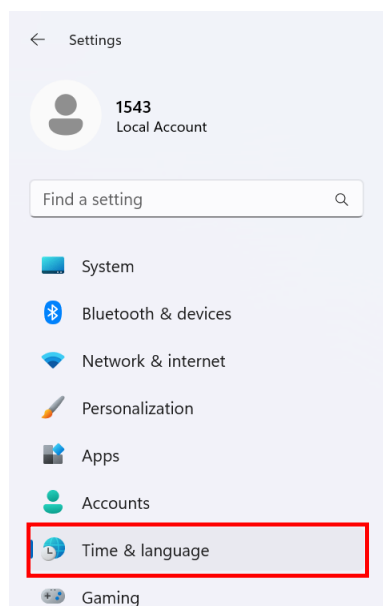
*Note: Only Windows edition that supports multi-language allows users to change the system display language, single language edition is not allow to add or change a second system display language.

Windows 11

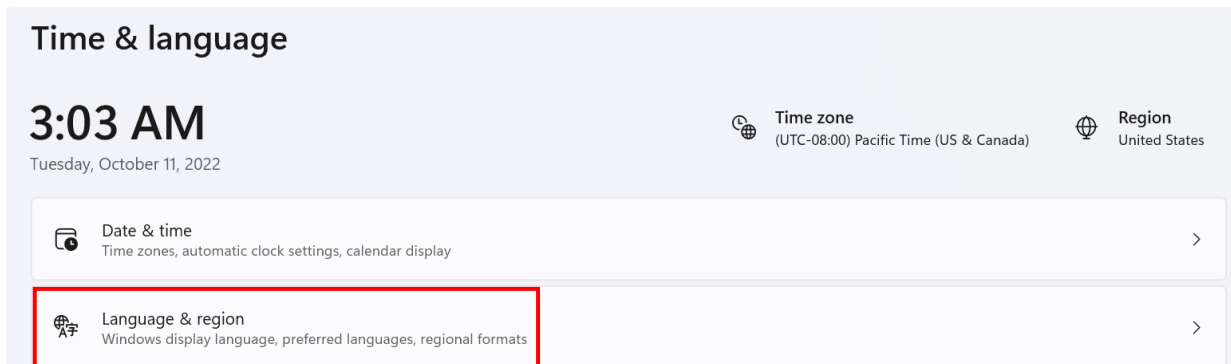
1. Open Windows Settings.



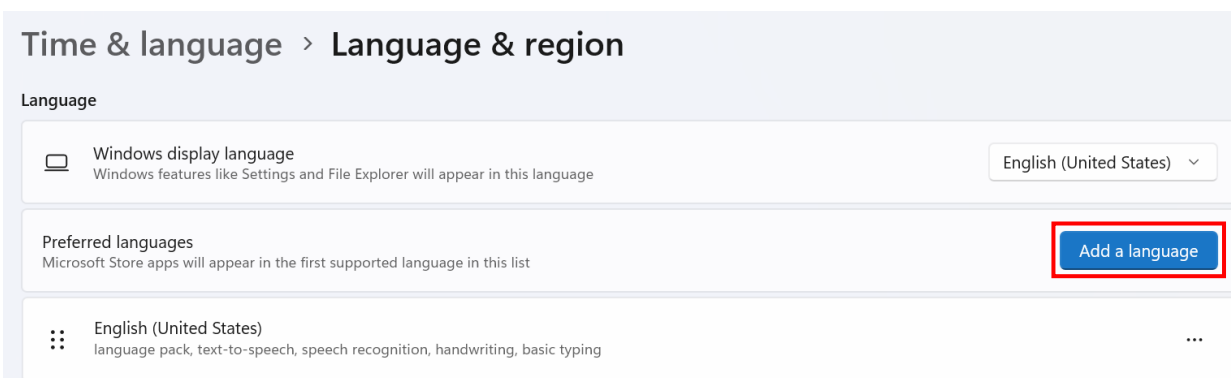
2. Click "Time and language".



3. Select “Language & Region”.



4. Click on “Add a language”.



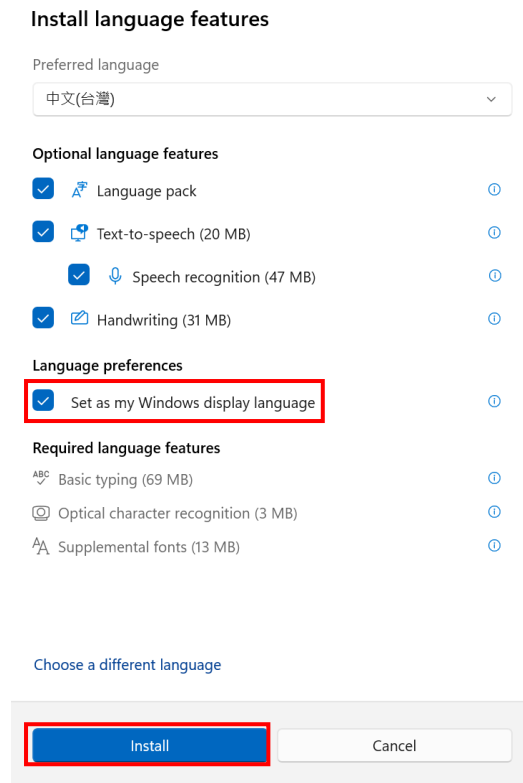
5. Select the preferred language.

6. Click “Next”.

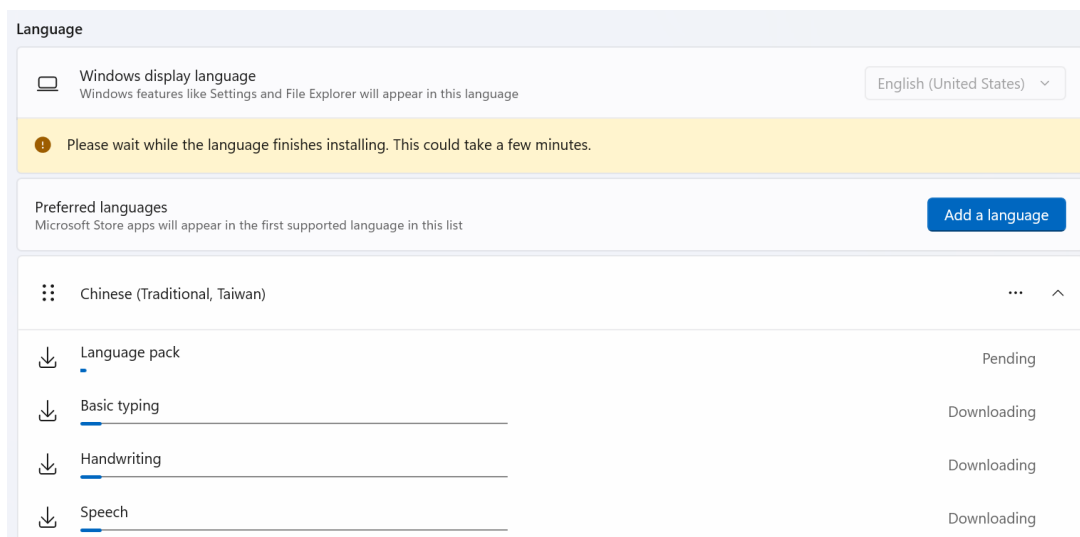


7. Toggle the option for “Set as my Windows display language”.

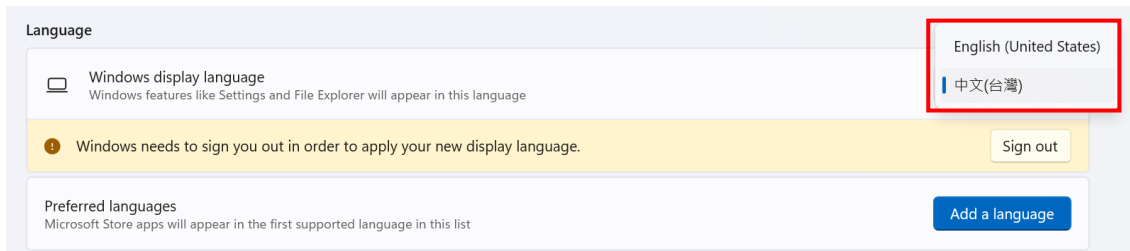
8. Click “Install”.



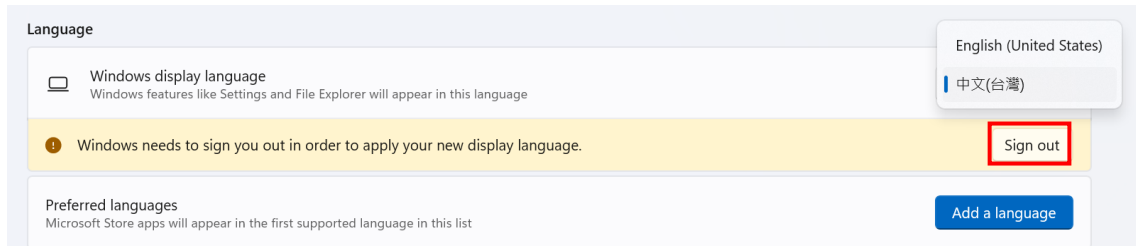
9. Wait for the language pack to finish installing.



10. To switch the language, click on the drop-down menu and select the preferred language.

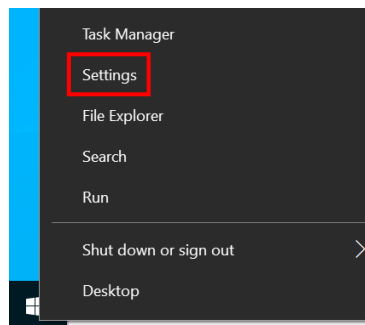


11. Click Sign Out and sign in again to apply changes.

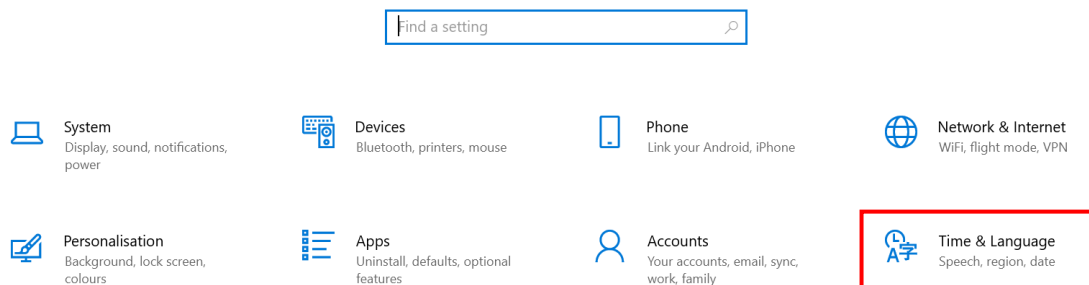


Windows 10

1. Open Windows Settings.

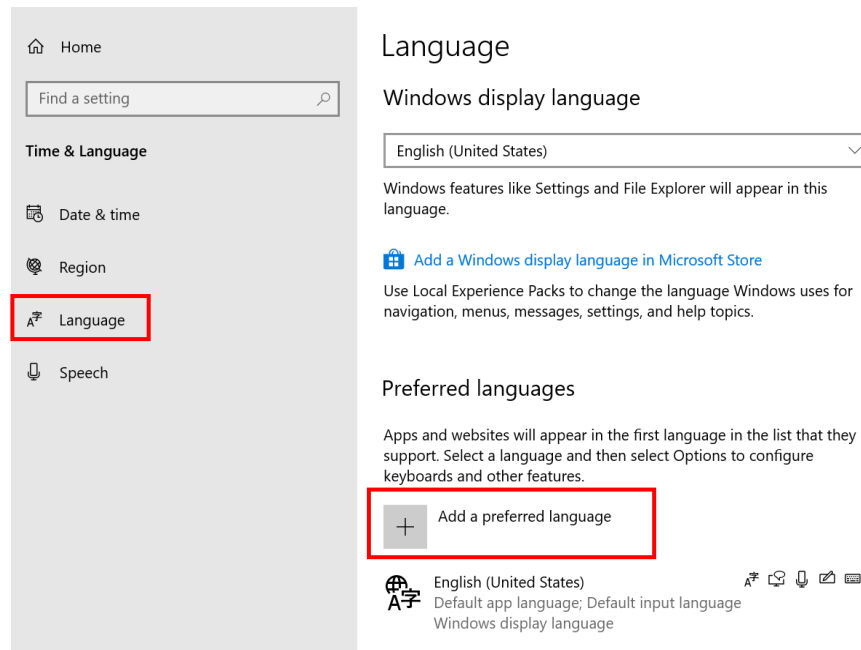


2. Click “Time and Language”.



3. Select “Language”.

4. Click “Add a preferred language”.



5. Select the preferred language.

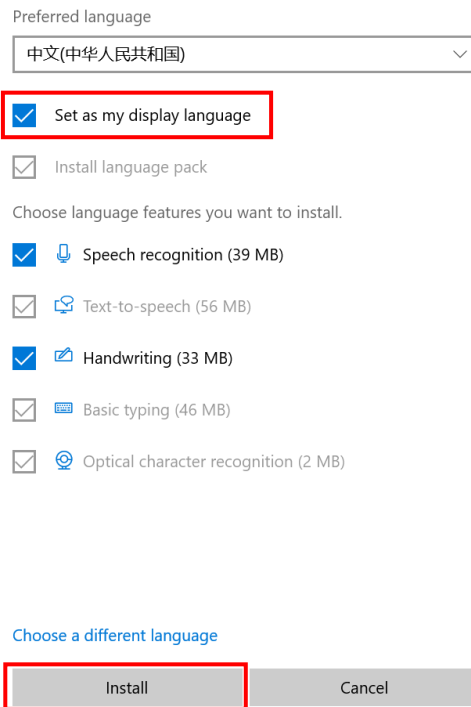
6. Click “Next”.



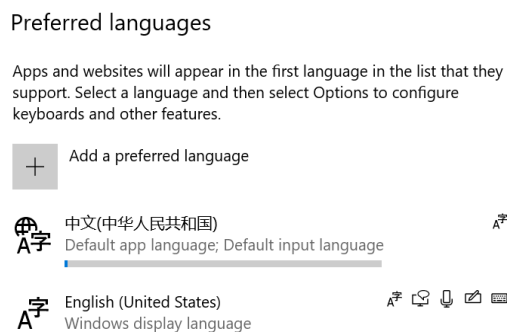
7. Toggle the option for “Set as my display language”.

8. Click “Install”.

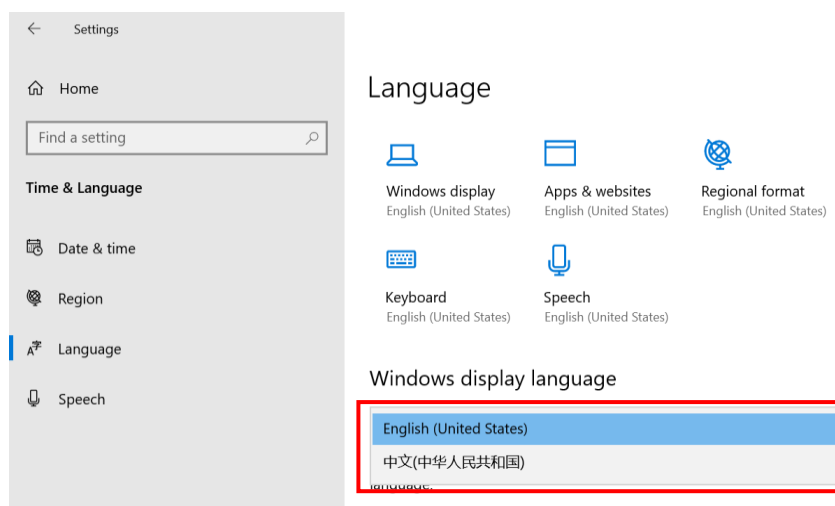
Install language features



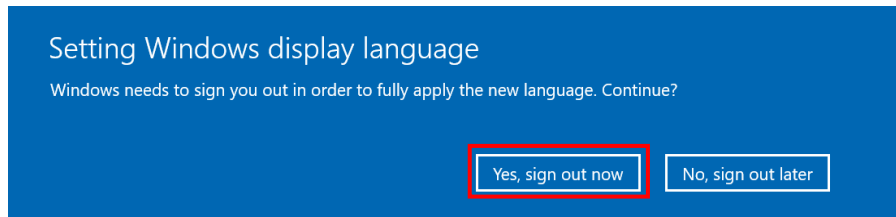
9. Wait for the language pack to finish installing.
